

*Barrowtown & Upper Sumas will be reconfigured from K-7 to K-5 in September of 2017 and capacities have been adjusted to reflect this.

Space, Program and Education Issues:

This family of schools is projected to experience growth at the secondary and middle school grade cohorts between 2018 and 2028. There will be a space shortfall of approximately **159** at secondary schools and **110** at middle schools by 2028. In contrast the K-5 schools in this family will experience maturing trends and potentially a slight gain in surplus or residual space.

There are four Strong Start Centres within this family of schools, at Alexander Elementary, Dormick Park Elementary, Godson Elementary and Jackson Elementary. The Ministry provides a deduction equivalent to 1 classroom from the operational capacity for each Strong Start Centre. There are also 2 classrooms used for childcare in this family (at Godson and Jackson), which are not eligible for a Ministry capacity reduction.

Abbotsford Senior Secondary enrolment in September 2016 was 985 funded students utilizing 89% of the schools operating capacity (1100). Enrolment will reach 100% of operating capacity in 2019 and is projected to grow to 115% by 2030, requiring portables on site or other measures to relieve overcrowding.

In September 2016, Abbotsford Senior Secondary enrolment included:

- 765 regular students; 545 (71.2%) reside within catchment, 220 (28.8%) come from out of catchment.
- a net cross-catchment enrolment loss of regular students to other secondary schools in the district (inflow 220 less outflow 261 = -41).
- 121 International Baccalaureate students; 67 (55.4%) reside within catchment, 54 students (44.6%) come from out of catchment.
- 50 Career Program students; 31 (62%) reside within catchment, 19 (38%) come from out of catchment.
- 37 Soccer Academy students; 18 (49%) reside within catchment, 19 students (51%) come from out of catchment.
- a comprehensive net cross catchment loss for all programs (inflow 126 less outflow 375 = -249).
- 78 international students, not included in the enrolment and utilization calculations.

Abbotsford Middle enrolment in September 2016 was 658 funded students, which is approaching 110% utilization of the schools operating capacity (600). Enrolment will grow to 126% of operating capacity by 2020 and is projected level to 2030. Portables may be required to accommodate this long-term growth if other alternatives are not considered. 597 regular students, of whom 467 regular students (78.4%) reside within catchment while 129 regular students (21.6%) come from out of catchment. There are an additional 61 students enrolled in the school's Soccer Academy. 24 attend the academy from within the Abbotsford Middle Catchment; 34 come from outside the catchment.

Alexander Elementary enrolment in September 2016 was 216, utilizing 88% of the schools operating capacity (245). Enrolment will reach 100% by 2020 and is projected level to 2030.

Barrowtown Elementary enrolment in September 2016 was 69, utilizing 106% of the schools operating capacity (65). The school will be reconfigured from K-7 to K-5 in 2017, resulting in a slight loss in enrolment to 100% utilization of revised operating capacity (64) with no significant growth projected. The school had 1 portable classroom on site in September 2016.

Centennial Park Elementary enrolment in September 2016 was 274, utilizing 85% of the schools operating capacity (331) with relatively level projections to 2030. The school accommodates both a regular program and Early French Immersion program. The school had 1 portable classroom on site.

Dormick Park Elementary enrolment in September 2016 was 292, utilizing 125% of the schools operating capacity (241) with relatively level projections to 2030. There are 2 portable classrooms on site, which will need to be maintained on site to accommodate enrolment projections.

Godson Elementary in September 2016 was 355, utilizing 100% of the schools operating capacity (354). Although fluctuating, projected enrolment will grow slightly to 109% of operating capacity by 2030. The school had 2 portable classrooms on site in September 2016.

Jackson Elementary in September 2016 was 153, utilizing 69% of the schools operating capacity (222). Enrolment is projected to gradually grow to 100% utilization of the schools operating capacity between 2017 and 2025 with level projections to 2030.

Upper Sumas Elementary in September 2016 was 209, utilizing 84% utilization of the schools 2016 operating capacity (248). The school will be reconfigured from K-7 to K-5 in 2017, resulting in a slight loss in enrolment to 174 students in 2017, utilizing 72% of revised operating capacity (241). Enrolment is projected with a declining trend to 53% utilization by 2030.

Alternative Accommodation Considerations, Abbotsford Senior Secondary Family of Schools:

The following are potential considerations for addressing the capacity/utilization and/or facility condition issues.

1) Capacity Project Alternatives:

- a) Status Quo No space additions
 - i) The status quo alternative does not support long term planning to address space shortages for the Abbotsford Secondary family of schools.
 - ii) Enrolment is projected to grow over operating capacity, requiring portables within 10 to 15 years, if there are no space additions and currently approved programs and grade configuration are maintained.

b) Other considerations:

- i) Addition to Abbotsford Senior Secondary
- ii) Educational Use of Neighbourhood Learning Centre Space
- iii) Addition to Abbotsford Middle

2) Program Alternatives:

- a) Status Quo No program changes and no additions
 - i) Regular K-5 program will be maintained at all seven elementary schools with no district program additions.
- b) Location of district programs.

3) Other Considerations to manage individual school capacity/utilization issues:

- i) Program moves/relocation
- ii) Boundary moves/adjustments
- iii) Out of Catchment Enrolment Management

4) Facility upgrade (routine capital, replacement or major renovation) Alternatives:

- a) Status Quo No major upgrades
 - i) The FCI related condition of the six elementary schools in this family of schools will need to be addressed.
